Executive Summary

In 2024, NGYouthSDGs strengthened its mission to amplify youth voices, drive climate advocacy, and foster community development through transformative initiatives. By equipping young leaders across Nigeria with training, resources, and platforms for meaningful engagement, the organisation empowered youth to actively contribute to achieving the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

Key programs such as Empowering Youth Civil Societies to Build Stronger Communities, the Youth Activators' Lab, Elevating Youth Voices, Building Trust, and Civic Cohesion highlighted NGYouthSDGs' commitment to capacity-building, advocacy, and partnerships for collective action. Collaborations with esteemed organisations including the German Missions in Nigeria, International Labour Organization (ILO), Alan and Babette Sainsbury Charitable Trust, Oxfam Nigeria, Amnesty International Nigeria, LEAP Africa, and Nigeria Youth Futures Fund (NYFF) expanded outreach and deepened impact.

Among the year's highlights was the Empowering Youth Civil Societies to Build Stronger Communities initiative, which trained youth and youth-led organisations to champion climate resilience through policy advocacy, partnerships, and grassroots actions. Similarly, the CLiP project fostered civic engagement and inclusive governance by engaging civic champions, volunteers, and over 40,000 stakeholders through media and interactive sessions.

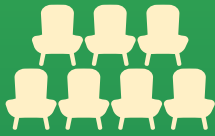
The 2024 International Youth Day (IYD) celebration, themed From Awareness to Action, exemplified SDG progress through intergenerational collaboration. The event engaged over 670 in-person attendees, 1,835 virtual participants, and spotlighted 50 youth leaders while fostering partnerships and honouring achievements through the Youth Day Spotlight Awards.

The Youth Activators' Lab equipped 33 young leaders from 18 Nigerian states with transformative leadership skills, resulting in \$10,500 in external grants to support advocacy, research, and project implementation.

NGYouthSDGs also addressed leadership development, civic participation, resource mobilisation, employability, and volunteerism through workshops, boot camps, and initiatives like the Climate Voices Nigeria Boot Camp and the #GreenConvo series. The Youth SDGs Cafe sessions facilitated collaboration between youth-led organisations, government officials, and private-sector actors, furthering innovative SDG solutions.

Looking forward, NGYouthSDGs remain steadfast in empowering young Nigerians as catalysts for achieving the SDGs, fostering innovation, collaboration, and transformational leadership for a more inclusive and sustainable future.

Key Programmes Updates

NGYouthSDGs has continued to deliver on its mission through various successful programs aimed at youth engagement, climate advocacy, and community development.



Our key highlights include:

1 - Empowering Youths and Youth CSOs to Drive Climate Action in Nigeria: #ClimateActionForStrongerNaija

With the support of the German Embassy in Nigeria, the Empowering Youth Civil Societies to Build Stronger Communities project has demonstrated how youth-led initiatives can be at the forefront of implementing Nigeria's National Adaptation Plan (NAP) and Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs).



Key Milestones Achieved:

Capacity Building and Grassroots Leadership

15 youth-led CSOs across Delta, Enugu, Kaduna, Nasarawa, and Ondo States were equipped with the skills needed to engage in climate policy processes through expert-led training sessions. These CSOs, in turn, mobilised 175 additional youth organisations, conducting hybrid step-down training that extended the program's reach and impact.

Inclusive Youth Engagement

Through an open call, over 3,000 youths applied to participate in capacity-building sessions. Out of these, 412 young leaders were selected, prioritising women and persons with disabilities. A virtual graduation ceremony celebrated the commitment of 200 participants from 34 states, who are now better positioned to champion climate resilience.

Amplifying Impact Through Partnerships and Innovation

The launch of a Learning Management System (LMS) provided a centralised hub for climate resources, fostering long-term sustainability. Meanwhile, community dialogues and Local Adaptation Plans of Action (LAPAs) co-created with grassroots stakeholders ensured that voices from the marginalised groups shaped state-specific climate responses.

Defining Nigeria's Priorities for COP29

At the Nigeria Futures Summit, youth CSOs convened with policymakers, solidifying collective priorities for COP29. The project showcases the transformative power of youth in advancing climate resilience and building a sustainable future for Nigeria. 2- Elevating Youth Voices, Building Trust, and Civic Cohesion

Launched in March 2024, the **Elevating Youth Voices, Building Trust, and Civic Cohesion Project (CLiP)** aims to inspire youth participation in local democracy and bridge the gap between young people and lawmakers. Supported by the Nigeria Youth Futures Fund (NYFF) and LEAP Africa, the project empowers young leaders in Enugu East Senatorial District (Enugu North, Enugu South, and Nkanu West) through capacity-building, advocacy, and creative campaigns.

Below are some of our highlights

Youth Empowerment and Civic Leadership

Through an open call, the project engaged 5 civic champions and 25 volunteers who participated in an intensive virtual training session. Expert facilitators delivered engaging modules, achieving a 90-100% relevance rating. A subsequent residential training equipped participants with practical skills in active citizenship and advocacy while fostering networks and creating impactful campaign resources.

Grassroots Engagement for Change

From step-down training sessions to focus group discussions, and in-depth interview sessions to town hall meetings, youth leaders engaged over 200 stakeholders, including lawmakers, addressing barriers to youth participation in governance. Notably, Hon. Princess Obiajulu Ugwu pledged ongoing support for dialogue and inclusive governance.

Civic Action Through Media and Advocacy

We had two radio programs reaching over 40,000 listeners and a press conference with Dream FM Enugu and NAN that amplified youth voices in governance conversations.

Tools for Inclusive Governance

The Practical Guidelines Toolkit for Youth-Lawmaker Engagement provides actionable strategies for fostering civic cohesion was developed. Insights from focus groups and interviews shaped this transformative resource. Download the toolkit [here](#).

A Vision for Inclusive Communities

At the Project Impact Sharing Session, 40 youth and CSO leaders exchanged best practices, with 75% reporting actionable insights to enhance engagement.

3 - International Youth Day (IYD) 2024: From Awareness to Action

Since its adoption in 1999, August 12th has been recognised as International Youth Day (IYD) to raise awareness about the challenges young people face and to encourage their active contributions to societal development. In line with this vision, NGYouthSDGs has commemorated IYD annually **since 2017**, emphasising youth leadership for sustainable development and fostering environments for holistic youth development.

With young people aged 15-35 making up 70% of Nigeria's 200 million population, their role in achieving the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) is crucial. IYD serves as a platform to enhance youth participation in addressing critical areas such as Gender Equality, Climate Action, Education, Decent Work, and Active Citizenship.

The 2024 IYD celebration, themed "From Awareness to Action: Empowering Youth in Nigeria for the SDGs," sought to elevate Nigeria's progress towards the SDGs while promoting intergenerational collaboration.

Key Achievements and Impact Highlights

- **Partnerships:** 8 national and international partners supported the event.
- **Participation:**
 - **Day One:** 420 in-person attendees
 - **Day Two:** 250+ in-person attendees
 - **Virtual Engagement:** 1,835 viewers on YouTube and Facebook
- **Youth Recognition:** 50 youths spotlighted, 10 Youth Day Spotlight Award recipients, and 3 winners of the Oxfam Green Challenge.

Participants' Feedback

- **93.2%** of attendees reported enhanced knowledge and tools for community impact.
- **70.9%** expressed that the award ceremonies significantly boosted their drive to advance the SDGs in their communities.

4. The Youth Activators' Lab

This is a one-year leadership and development program designed for young people aged 18 to 29. Participants collaborate with the Network of Youth for Sustainable Initiative (NGYouthSDGs) to advocate for youth rights in Nigeria.

The program focuses on impact and leadership, equipping associates with the motivation, frameworks, and critical thinking skills needed to drive systemic change. It fosters the development of leadership qualities that enable associates to lead transformation within themselves and their communities. Additionally, the program provides exposure to globally renowned mentors in the social impact space.

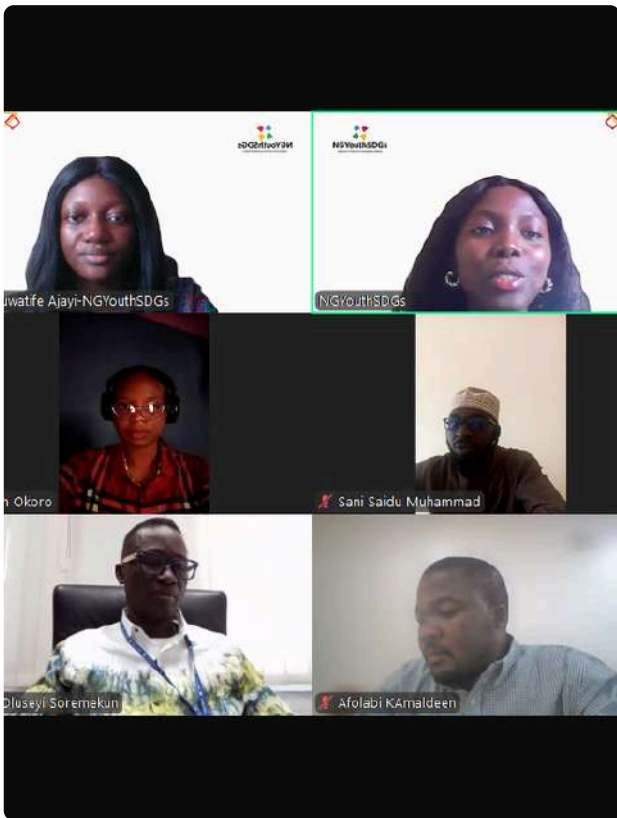
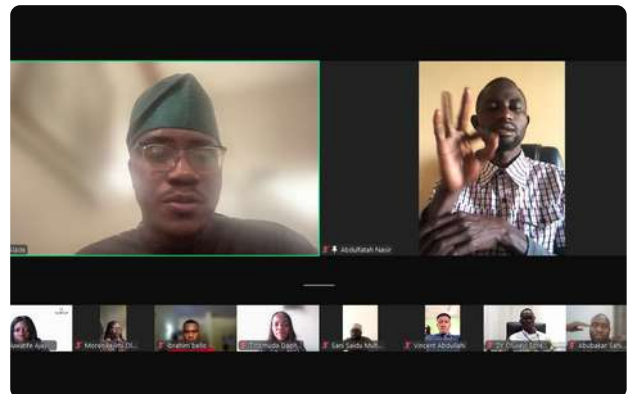
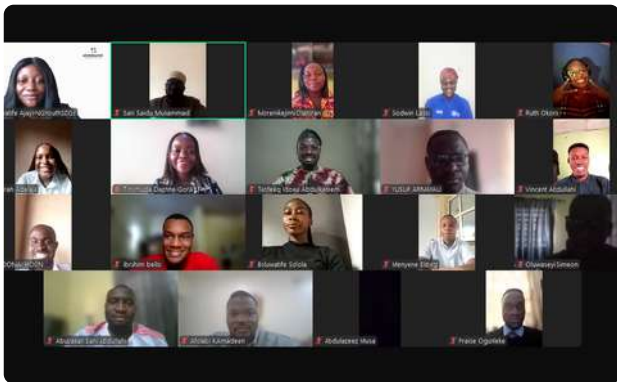
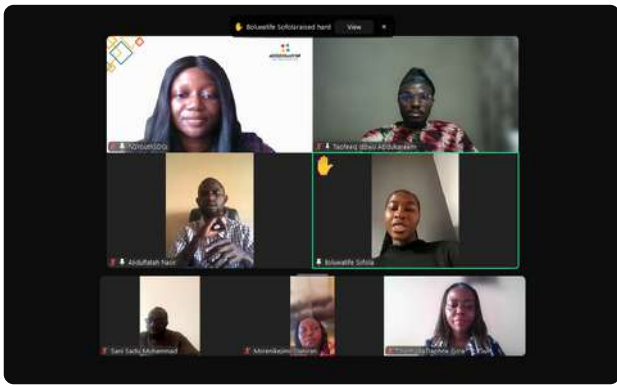
Key Highlights of the Program

- 33 associates onboarded
- 18 Nigerian states represented
- 93.1% of associates reported significant professional and personal development through the program.
- 10 learning sessions were completed, enhancing skills and knowledge.
- 3 mentoring sessions with renowned global change leaders.
- 10 high-level meetings and co-implemented projects with NGYouthSDGs.
- As a result of learnings on the program, \$10,500 in external grants have been won by associates to support their advocacy, research, and project implementation efforts.

5 - Resourcing Youth Movement and Activists

Through online consultations, workshops, and dialogue sessions, young people worldwide are contributing ideas to accelerate the implementation of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and promote inclusive multilateralism.

In alignment with this global agenda, NGYouthSDGs, in collaboration with the British Council, hosted a dialogue session in Lagos, Nigeria, on August 16, 2024. The event brought together young founders and changemakers to discuss challenges, strategies, and needs in accessing resources for their initiatives.

The session included a documentary screening based on the Speak Up Stand Out (SUSO) project, which engaged 20 youth campaigners across Abuja, Enugu, and Lagos to address youth priorities in employment, education, peace and security, and active citizenship. Following the screening, participants engaged in a guided discussion to identify solutions for resource mobilisation and funding.

Key Outcomes and Highlights

- Participants shared challenges such as funding gaps, complex financing systems, and a lack of mentorship, proposing actionable solutions to strengthen youth-led initiatives.
- Recommendations focused on leveraging private sector partnerships, improving proposal writing, and enhancing communication strategies.
- Networking opportunities allowed participants to build connections with peers and stakeholders in the development sector.
- The session fostered collaboration and provided a platform for changemakers to share best practices, building a stronger, more resilient youth movement.

This dialogue emphasised the importance of sustained investment in youth initiatives, contributing valuable insights for the Summit of the Future.

With a global youth population of 1.2 billion and 151 million in Nigeria alone - young people are a vital force for advancing SDGs action, particularly when collaboration and partnership are prioritised. Youth and youth-led organisations play a critical role at the heart of SDG implementation, bringing the innovation and creativity needed to drive initiatives that address pressing global challenges.

7 - Youth and the Pact for the Future: United Nations Day Event

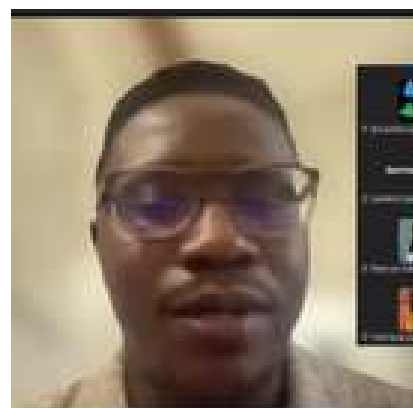
The Nigeria Youth SDGs Network (NGYouthSDGs), in collaboration with the United Nations Information Centre, Abuja, recently hosted an impactful event to strengthen youth leadership and encourage active engagement among young Nigerians in shaping their future. The event was aligned with the UN's Pact for the Future, which focuses on sustainable development and financing, peace and security, science, technology, innovation, digital cooperation, youth empowerment, and transforming global governance. The program featured panel sessions with key thought leaders, an interactive dialogue that engaged youth voices, and a spoken word presentation that creatively inspired attendees. Collectively, these elements fostered a stronger connection between young Nigerians and the UN's mission, laying the groundwork for sustainable, youth-driven change.

Highlight and Achievements

- 100 percent of attendees who completed the feedback form reported an increased awareness of the United Nations' Pact for the Future.
- In response to "How likely are you to take action on the Sustainable Development Goals based on what you learned today?" 100 percent indicated they were likely to take action.
- 100 percent of participants found the insights from the session beneficial to their professional and personal development.
- The event successfully deepened understanding of the global goals and fostered a renewed commitment to SDG action among young Nigerians.

8. Job Sprint: Employability Workshop for Nigerian Youths

Finding decent work for young people in Nigeria is becoming more precarious especially for those with little or no university education. As we embrace the digital economy, it is important that youth are provided with the right skills and knowledge to get and stay in jobs.

In response, NGYouthSDGs collaborated with the Mandela Washington Fellowship Alumni Association of Nigeria (MWFAAN), Jobberman Nigeria, and American Corner Ikeja to organise a one-day employability workshop. This event equipped participants with crafting a winning curriculum vitae and how to ace job interviews as well as their rights as employees.

Key Highlights and Impact

Partners: 3 partner organisations – MWFAAN, Jobberman Nigeria, and American Corner.

Participants: 50 attendees benefited from the workshop.

Support Services: Free CV reviews were provided to 32 participants.

Feedback:

- 75% of participants felt empowered for career advancement.
- 50% reported making meaningful connections with professionals and peers.

To address youth unemployment sustainably, Nigeria requires a multifaceted approach that includes policy reform, increased investment in education, and comprehensive job readiness initiatives. By empowering young people with the right skills and knowledge, initiatives like this workshop contribute to fostering sustainable development and promoting social justice.

9 - Climate Voices Nigeria Bootcamp

In 2023, NGYouthSDGs launched Climate Voices Nigeria, a social media live series designed to engage and educate young Nigerians on critical climate topics, including climate change, education, loss and damage, and policy. This initiative aimed to empower young people as advocates for climate action, fostering a generation of informed and inspired individuals ready to tackle climate challenges and drive sustainable solutions.

Building on the success of 2023, the Climate Voices Nigeria Bootcamp was introduced in 2024 to inspire environmentally conscious young leaders across Nigerian states. The bootcamp empowered participants to actively engage in climate advocacy, influence policy decisions, and implement sustainable initiatives in their communities, contributing to a more resilient Nigeria. Supported by the Alan and Babette Sainsbury Charitable Trust, the bootcamp attracted 500 accepted applicants.

10. Raising a Wave of Climate Leaders

The Network of Youth for Sustainable Initiative (NGYouthSDGs) organised an X (formerly known as Twitter) space conversation on the theme "Raising a Wave of Climate Leaders." The event had Olumide Idowu, popularly known as Mr. Climate, as the speaker. This Space Conversation is a flagship of Climate Voices Nigeria, one of our core programmes focused on amplifying the voices of youth in Nigeria for leading climate action, thereby inspiring a wave of environmentally conscious and informed young climate leaders from different Nigerian states.

The interactive discussion started with Praise Okezie, the Communications Associate of NGYouthSDGs, giving an introduction to the work of NGYouthSDGs and our commitment over the years to ensuring that young people across Nigeria access Climate Education. She also added that the Twitter space conversation would be an opportunity to share insights on the upcoming Climate Voices Nigeria Boot Camp and how young people can be part of this exciting opportunity for climate action and environmental sustainability.

11. The Green Convo

As part of our dedication to ensuring the meaningful involvement of young people through initiatives and policies that empower them to lead and thrive, NGYouthSDGs launched the social media program, #GreenConvo.

The #GreenConvo is a bi-monthly program on X (formerly known as Twitter) aimed at addressing crucial issues related to climate innovation and entrepreneurship.

The June edition of the Green Convo coincided with World MSME Day, highlighting the significant role of MSMEs in achieving the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). This edition provided a platform to discuss the Role of Youth in Climate Innovation. This edition focused on "Building a Sustainable Future: The Role of Youth in Climate Innovation" and featured two esteemed speakers: Rita Idehai, Founder of Ecorbarter and Fela Buyi, Founder of Salubata.

Both speakers shared their experiences in establishing climate-smart innovative enterprises and discussed the pivotal role of young people in climate innovation and economic development. 12 - 2024 International Volunteers' Day

International Volunteers' Day (IVD), celebrated annually by NGYouthSDGs, recognizes the invaluable contributions of volunteers to community development and sustainable growth. This year's event, held virtually on December 5, 2024, centred on the theme "Diverse Volunteers, Stronger Communities." It highlighted how diverse backgrounds and abilities strengthen volunteer efforts in addressing challenges like poverty, inequality, and climate change.

The program featured 100 participants on Zoom and over 200 views on YouTube Live, including youth leaders, volunteers, and development practitioners. Sessions included a panel discussion on "Harnessing Diversity in Volunteerism: Building Inclusive Communities," showcasing how inclusion enhances resilience, and a case study of NGYouthSDGs champions leading impactful projects. An interactive session allowed participants to share personal volunteer stories, fostering connection and inspiration to drive meaningful change.

Program Outcomes

The event left a lasting impression on participants, reaffirming the importance of volunteerism and its role in building stronger, more inclusive communities. Feedback from attendees highlighted the event's relevance, effectiveness, and ability to inspire action. **The following key points illustrate the positive impact the event had on participants**

- 99% of attendees found the theme Diverse Volunteers, Stronger Communities highly relevant to their interests and work.
- 97.1% of participants considered the event effective in providing practical insights and tools for volunteerism and community development.
- 99% of attendees reported feeling more motivated to engage in volunteerism after the event.
- 83% of participants rated the event as impactful overall.
- 82.7% rated the panel session Harnessing Diversity in Volunteerism: Building Inclusive Communities as excellent.

NGYouthSDGs Launches Project on Youth Leadership in Climate Action Policies and Implementation
